






## **Required Materials for Instructions:**

- 3. Writing utensils (mechanical or regular pencils)
- 4. Ballpoint pens: red, green, black, or blue (preferably two different dark colors)
- 5. Organization system for your worksheets (such as folders or a plastic accordion folder)
- 6. Highlighters
- 7. Scissors
- 8. Dry erase marker
- 9. 2 reams of paper
- 10.2 boxes of tissues (Kleenex)
- 11. Scissors
